This booklet provides a snapshot of socioeconomic development progress and general information about potential investment areas across all sectors in Baringo. It highlights the key milestones of devolution in the last 10 years and bankable opportunities that are investor ready and provide their overview, highlighting information that is important to note.

### ABOUT BARINGO

The County is located between longitudes 35 30" and 36 30" East and between latitudes 0 10" and 1 40" South. The Equator cuts across the county at the Southern part.

It covers an area of 10,976.4 Km<sup>2</sup> (4,238 M<sup>2</sup>) which is the size of The Gambia or Jamaica. Of the 11,015.3 sq km, 165 sq km is service water. Lake Baringo covers an area of 170 sq km, Lake Bogoria 38 sq km while Lake Kamnorok covers 1Km<sup>2</sup>.

Baringo County borders 8 counties namely:-

- Turkana and Samburu to the North
- Laikipia to the East
- Nakuru and Kericho to the South
- Uasin Gishu to the South West
- Elgeyo Marakwet and West Pokot to the West

## POPULATION

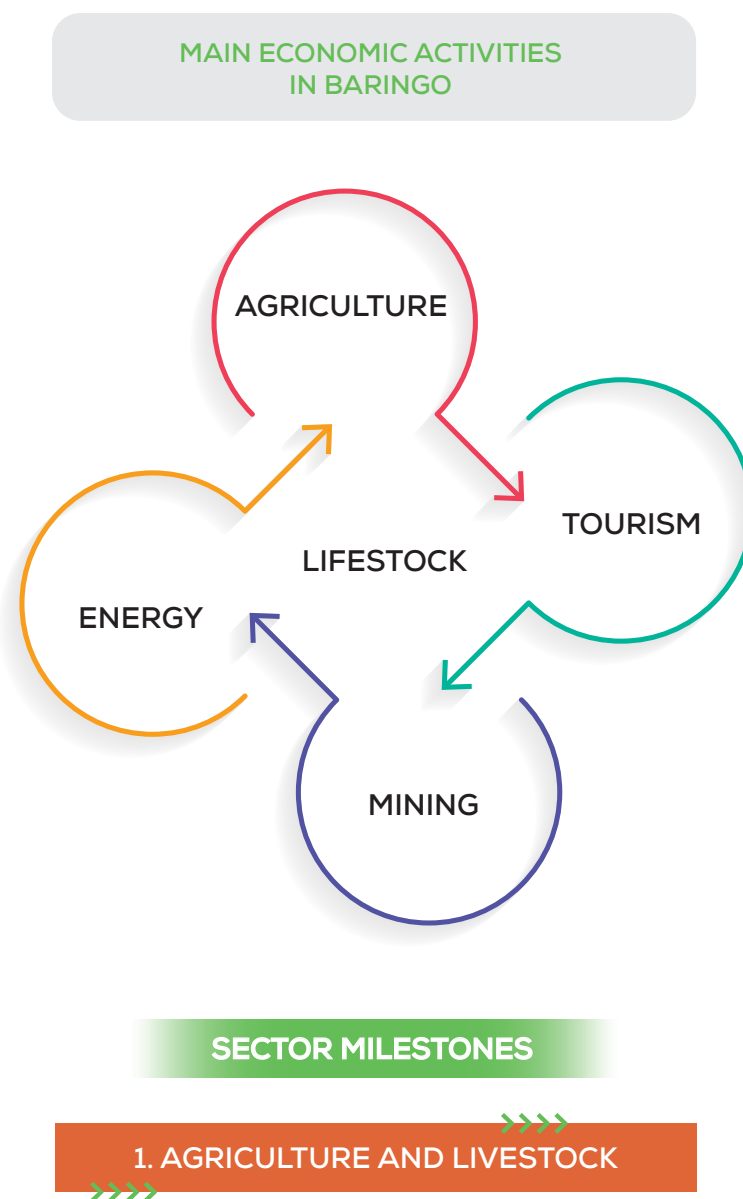
The 2019 census put Baringo County population at 666,763 people with over 50% being under the age of 18. The Census projected to increase to 764,411 in 2025; and 794,793 by 2027 using intercensal population growth rate for the county.

## ECONOMY

Baringo has various Agro Ecological Zones which demarcate the county into four main livelihood zones with pastoralism being the most significant production system (62%), followed by agro-pastoralism (14%), Fishing (8%). Mixed farming livelihood involves about 16% of population.(FMHB 2018)

Baringo is centrally placed and presents access to huge market for goods and services given a population of approximately 853, 515 people; and over 10 million people in the 8 immediate surrounding counties (2019 Census).

The County Headquarters, Kabarnet is only one and a half hours away from Moi International Airport, Eldoret, which is about 60 miles away. It still has huge tracts of land suitable for various investments and it is well connected by A104, B4, C51, and B54 between its major towns as well as to other urban markets within the region.



The County is endowed with all agro ecological zones and its produce include maize, cut flowers, groundnuts, coffee, fruits (mango, paw paws, water melons, passions, bananas) Aloe, cotton, coffee, pyrethrum, onions, etc. All these are not fully tapped and present potential for investment.

## a.)The Baringo Coffee Story

The Baringo county government developed a concrete road map in 2015 for the revival of the coffee sub-sector which local farmers had abandoned due to fluctuation in market prices, lack of access to affordable farm inputs such as seedlings, fertilizers and chemicals, a problem that made producers protest by cutting down the coffee bushes.

The roadmap culminated in the establishment of a Sh100 million Baringo Cha Coffee mill in Katimok, Baringo North Sub County, which started running from June 2020. The feat was achieved through collaboration between the National Government and the County Government of Baringo which facilitated the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding with a Korean Investor, Rev Cha Bo Yong towards the construction of the ultra-modern coffee mill two lines that can mill both parchment and mbuni beans.

The machine has a lab, warehouse and information Centre to boost farmers' income through value addition. The factory has a milling capacity of 1.0 tons per hour has reduce the cost of milling services, transportation costs and sometimes short-changing of grades in mills far away from the farmers.

Buoyed by the commissioning of the first ever coffee mill in the region, farmers in Baringo are intensifying their venture in coffee farming. From increased activity in the value chain, farmers earned 45M from sale of 80 tonnes through direct market in 2023. Farmers who sold their coffee through direct coffee market in S. Korea received promptly their payment of KES 25M. Earning the current price of Shs 565 per kilo of Coffee up from Shs 280 in 2013, farmers can now afford to educate their children and enjoy a decent life with the proceeds from their coffee produce.

To further support consolidate and expand the gains so far made, the county government has intensified planting of coffee by providing farmers with subsidized coffee seedlings worth KES 30 million in the last 10 years. It has supplied farmers with over 100,000 seedlings and supported coffee farmer societies with 600 kilos of certified seeds to raise seedlings for supply to its members. In 2020 alone 30,000 coffee seedlings were supplied to our farmers in a bid to increase acreage of land under coffee from 700 hectares in 2013 to 3,000 hectares by the year 2022.

The cash crop mostly grown in rural areas is considered organic by default because majority of farmers still use compost manure instead of using inorganic fertilizers. This gives Baringo Coffee a unique taste and therefore a competitive edge.

## b) Meat Value Chain

In developing the meat value chain, the County Government has invested over Shs 60 Million in breed upgrade programme to introduce highly productive meat variety livestock for the meat industry

The County has invested in a Shs 200 million Export Abattoir at Maoi in Baringo South (90% complete), and National and local market slaughterhouses in the pastoralist areas of Barwesa, Loruk and Ngendalel. Going forward, the County will disallow the transportation of live animals to fully utilize the value addition infrastructure which include a Leather Tannery in Mogotio.

## c) The Milk Value Chain

The county has implemented a number of strategies to enhance milk production including investing Shs 15 Million in the promotion of the use of Artificial Insemination to improve Dairy Cow breeds, supporting dairy farmers on the enhancement of feed availability and training them on the new technologies. This also has included the enhancing of livestock disease management.

Baringo County has established a Shs 300 Million Milk Processing Plant in Eldama Ravine milk which will be an incentive to the farmers to produce more as the price is bound to go up. This initiative is implemented through Baringo Agricultural Marketing Services Cooperative Society Limited (BAMSCOS), a Cooperative Union which was registered on 28th March 2012 with a primary membership of 22 Dairy Co-operative societies in Baringo County.



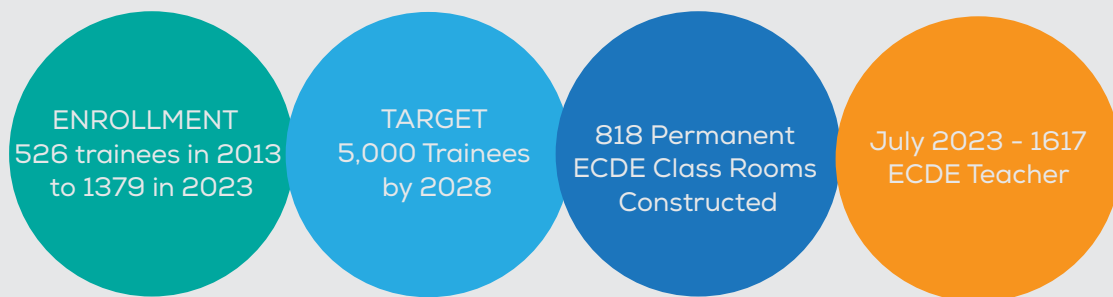
### 3. EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT EDUCATION, VOCATIONAL TRAINING AND LIBRARY SERVICES

In the last decade, the County Government has invested heavily in ECDE infrastructure. Over 818 Permanent class rooms have constructed and more will be completed by the end of 2023/24 FY. This is an achievement of 71% of having at least one modern classroom in the 1153 ECDE centers in the County. Upon attainment of the target, the County will embark on phase two with an intention of attaining two classrooms per centre.

In the Vocational training section, 9 new VTCs were constructed and rehabilitation of the 13 existing institutions. The county invested over Kshs 25 in acquisition of modern tools and equipment and will continue in the same path going forward. To boost uptake of courses in VTCs, bursaries are available to all trainees in the county which covers 60% of the tuition fee. Enrollment increased from 526 trainees in 2013 to 1379 in 2023. The aim is to enroll over 5,000 trainees by 2028.

Going forward, we have started making at least one VTC to be a centre of excellence in one trade area in every sub county. Already, centre of excellence in hospitality is coming up at Marigat VTC while Baringo VTC in Kabarnet will be centre of excellence in motor vehicle technology.

The challenge still remains to be high wage bill that limits the county from employing adequate number of instructors and also to sufficiently remunerate the ECDE teachers whose number stands at 1617 as at July 2023 among the highest teaching force per county in the country at large.



### 4. TOURISM & WILDLIFE

- The county is endowed with numerous natural attractions, among them the internationally acclaimed Lakes Baringo and Bogoria which are Ramsar Sites; it has gushing rivers, hills and valleys, small to large wild life, cold to hot springs, small to large birds. It has gorges and waterfalls, caves and rich fossil deposits. Its natural forests are beautiful. Owing to this, the county is a current candidate for the Global Geopark status. Currently Baringo County Government in partnership with UNESCO and KNATCOM are carrying out analysis of 15 Geosites for gazettelement in its quest to be declared a UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARK. This will Make Baringo County Geosites the first ones of its kind and only ones in Kenya; if granted the Global Geoparks Charter, Kenya will become the third host of Geosites in Africa after Morocco and Tanzania

- We pride ourselves in rich culture of our Tugen, pokot, Ill Chamus, Turkana and Kikuyu Communities.

- Baringo has a few world class tourists resort/lodges e.g. Lake Bogoria Spa Resort, Soi Safari Lodge, Island Camp, Samatian Camp, Tumbili Resort, Kibelion Hotel, Sobak, Lomanira Splendour etc.

- The county's over six forests are a sight to behold, with some of the tallest trees in the East African Region. They are catchment for birds.

BARINGO COUNTY GOVERNMENT developed regulations "Baringo County Community Wildlife Conservancies Fund 2014" that governs disbursements of grants to existing community conservancies within the County. It has enabled the community conservancies which have risen from the initial Two (2) to Current Fourteen (14) across the Six Sub Counties to organize themselves under the umbrella of Baringo County Community Association, attracting partnership support from the European Union (EU) and United Nation Development Programs (UNDP). These efforts are grounded on the Wildlife Conservation and management Act (2013) which provides a robust legislative basis for the provision of conditional rights to communities to manage wildlife and to benefit from its management by offering legal guideline for formation of a conservancy.

The programme provides appropriate incentives and conditions for rural people to invest their time, money and effort in conservation of wildlife and wild habitat. Through active management of wildlife in a sustainable way, benefits are now being generated for communities. This contribute to improving rural livelihoods by providing economic incentives and enabling land holders management authority to take key decisions regarding the use of wildlife and to earn direct income from flora and fauna found within their localities.

**5. WATER, SANITATION AND IRRIGATION**

Baringo County is a water scarce county with a big percentage of the populace depending on ground water abstraction for their domestic and livestock water demand. However significant strides towards addressing the challenge of providing clean and safe drinking water for domestic use, livestock and irrigation purposes have been made since the onset of devolution in 2013. So far, 317 boreholes have been sunk and fully equipped by the County Government which has increased the number of boreholes from 154 to the current 471. More than 32 masonry water storage tanks of various capacities have been constructed Countywide including several pipeline extensions enabling the residents to access safe water within a short distance.

Additionally, about 60 water pans of average capacity 12000m<sup>3</sup> have been constructed since the onset of devolution in 2013. These water pans currently harvest water, store and enable people to provide water to their livestock including conducting kitchen gardening or minor irrigation in their households. Several springs and intakes have also been constructed and pipelines extended to reach the users for domestic, livestock and irrigation purposes. Baringo County Government has also invested in the purchase of a drilling rig system. The machines are a set of 3 which includes a Rig, Support Truck and a Test Pumping Unit. As at now the machines have been used to drill an additional 51boreholes and rehabilitated 52 existing boreholes.

Before 2013, the water access coverage in Baringo County was below 35%. The Census Survey of 2019 had put Baringo County water access to safe drinking water at 39%. By allocating substantial budgetary resources to the Department, Baringo County Government through the leadership of H.E Governor Cheboi targets at pushing the water access to an average of 52% by the close of year 2027.

To improve food security especially in the face of climate change, the County Government has engineered a paradigm shift towards irrigated agriculture which guarantees stable agricultural productivity, as opposed to depending on the rains for farming activities.

In 2013 there were only 6 functioning Irrigation schemes with 2800ha (6900acres) under active crop production. As at 2023 we have 26 functional irrigation schemes with a productive 10,993 acres. The County Government has a target of raising it to 50,000 acres in the next 10 years against a County potential of 150,000 acres.

## 6. HEALTH SERVICES IN BARINGO

Against a backdrop of administrative units that had few to no healthcare facilities at the onset of Devolution in 2013, the County Government implemented a targeted approach to improve the accessibility and availability of these essential public facilities at a more local level, to conveniently serve a larger portion of the population.

In 2013 Baringo County had 172 public facilities where 67 facilities have been constructed and are operational; Tiaty East and Tiaty West Sub Counties doubled the number of facilities while Marigat Sub County had 20 additional facilities.

The most notable change occurred at Level 2 facilities, with the number increasing from 207 in 2013 to 239 in 2023. This represents a growth of 32 facilities or approximately 15.46%. The rise in Level 2 facilities indicates a deliberate effort to enhance and expand basic public services at this level over the given time frame. Level 2 facilities likely cater to more localized needs and have seen improvements or new establishments to address the demands of the population.

## 7. LANDS, HOUSING AND URBAN MANAGEMENT

- Towards properly guiding and controlling development across all sectors of the economy, the County Government of Baringo has an approved GIS based County Spatial Plan covering its entire estimated 11,015.3 Km<sup>2</sup>. The CSP which is a constitutional deliverable provided for in section 110 (1) of the County Government Act and is a major component of the Country Integrated Development Plan, provides a framework for a planned and coordinated sustainable use of resources to achieve Vision 2030 development goal of improving the equitable livelihoods for people across Baringo.

To zone various land uses and guide provision of social and physical infrastructure services, housing, commercial, industrial and other services within Kabarnet Municipality, a GIS based ten-year Integrated Urban development Plan (2019-2029) is in place.

## 8. ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION AND CLIMATE CHANGE RESILIENCE

Baringo County is extremely susceptible to the impacts of a changing climate because most livelihoods and economic activities are reliant on climate-sensitive natural resources. Droughts, floods, rising water levels in lakes, extreme weather events and rising temperatures in particular have had devastating consequences on the environment, society and economy.

The County has therefore rallied all stakeholders to invest in and play active roles in climate change mitigation and adaptation interventions for the last 10 years. It has provided leadership through formulation of Policies and legislations including the Baringo County Climate change Policy, 2021, Baringo County Climate change Act, 2022 and Baringo County Climate Change Regulation 2023, developed the County climate change action plan 2022-2027 as well as the Baringo County Forest Bill which is at the drafting stage. The developed County Participatory Climate Change Vulnerability Risk Assessment (PCRA) report is helping the County administration in making evidence based decisions regarding climate change issues.

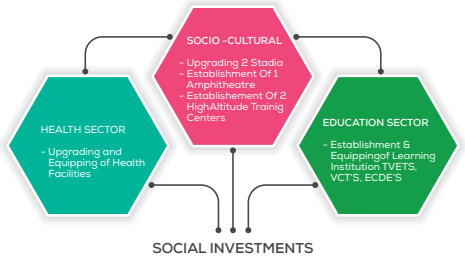
Among other strategies, the County Government has spearheaded the formation and inauguration of Ward Climate Change Committees, County Steering Committee and County Technical Planning Committee to oversee the implementation of the climate change Act in the County. This has been complemented by Climate change sensitization and awareness campaigns particularly in disaster risk areas within the County, implementation of soil and water conservation measures like soil erosion control and gulley control and rehabilitation, spring, wetland protection and catchment protection Restoration and re-vegetation of bare and degraded areas as well as the promotion of the use of renewable energy.

## 9. FINANCE AND ECONOMIC PLANNING

**COUNTY GOVERNMENT OF BARINGO** in the financial year 2016/2017 acquired and fully operationalized electronic revenue management system which has automated collections and helped in securing consistent growth in own-source revenue. This revenue growth pattern is also attributable to strengthened internal control systems, and the conducive business environment that the County Government continues to create, including upgrade of markets and sales yards; provision street lighting and construction of road infrastructure in major towns, as well as rural areas to ease access and spur productivity.

## INVESTOR-READY OPPORTUNITIES IN AGRO-PROCESSING

### (I) DEVELOPMENT OF COFFEE VALUE CHAIN

The area under coffee production in Baringo increased from 2300 hectares in 2018 to 3200 hectares in 2022. The increase is attributed to strategies to promote coffee cultivation including distribution of highly subsidized seedlings and farm input as well as enhanced extension services by the County Government.

It is further incentivised by the construction and operationalization of a Coffee Mill and the ready market for Baringo Coffee in Korea. The Coffee sub-sector therefore presents investment opportunities along the entire value chain.

### (II) ESTABLISHMENT OF A FRUIT PROCESSING PLANT

Fruits produced in Baringo are known to have high Brix content because of its diverse agro ecological zones and favourable weather conditions hence the viability of the investment. The viability is enhanced by the county government support to farmers through an affruatation programme to expand the acreages under Assorted fruits mainly Mangoes, Avocado, Macadamia, Pawpaw amongst others.

#### (IV) EQUIPPING & OPERATIONALIZATION OF A MILK PROCESSING PLANT

The county government is at the completion stage of a milk processing plant which will be operationalized through a PPP arrangement. The dairy farmers who have been organized into a vibrant umbrella co-operative society are already producing large volumes of milk capable of sustaining the processing plant. The geo-sites include waterfalls, cliffs, Hills & escarpments, gorges, culture and wildlife. Majority of these sites are yet to be fully developed thus presenting investment opportunities to the communities in Baringo and any other investor interested in leveraging on the Tourism potential in Baringo.
